





INFORMATION ON Rank Choice Voting:

Did you know that you are **NOT** required to mark your second, third, fourth, etc. choices on the ballot.

Proponents of ranked choice voting argue the system encourages candidates to build broader coalitions, eliminates the spoiler effect and discourages negative campaigning. Opponents say it's confusing and can result in a candidate without the largest number of first-choice votes ultimately prevailing.

Because they take place over multiple rounds that are tabulated only once all first-choice votes are counted, elections in Alaska and Maine that advance to ranked choice are often resolved a week or more after Election Day.







THE STEALING of ROAD-SIDE CAMPAIGN SIGNS IS NOT A POLITICAL STATEMENT. IT IS CRIMINAL THEFT

During the past three weeks, dozens of road-side campaign signs have been stolen here in Hiram and also in nearby towns. I have had similar reports from friends in Porter, Fryeburg, Steep Falls, and many other places. At the start of October, I installed signs for Harris-Walz, Nickie Sekera, and Jared Golden in 4 places here in my town. Two of the places were on the road-side of my own properties on Pequawket Trail; two other places were along public parks in our village.

Starting about two weeks ago, the signs began disappearing during nights; I replaced missing signs with my extra signs. As of Saturday morning, I have used all of my 7 Harris-Walz signs and all 9 of my Sekera signs, and ALL of them are gone. Along the road-side of my home property now, there is just one very lonely Golden sign. NOTH-ING else. Someone else in town also installed a few of the Harris-Walz and Sekera signs; those are also all gone. Now, when you drive through Hiram Village, there are NO road-side signs for Harris-Walz or Sekera, but there is still an abundance of signs around the village for several other candidates.

The theft of these signs is sickening and illegal. The criminal theft of these signs is depriving me and many others of our 1st Amendment right to free speech, to be able to publicly and legally express our opinions. As explained in a NewsCenter Maine report of October 24, "In Maine, stealing a political sign from public property can result in a \$250 fine. If the theft occurs on private property, offenders could face up to six months in prison and a fine of \$1,000." The report "...stressed the importance of leaving signs alone unless they belong to you or you have explicit permission to remove them."

The theft of the signs has me disgusted, and aggravated, but not discouraged. It seems to me that the only reason that someone would sneak around during night times, illegally stealing my campaign signs, is that they are desperately fearful that the candidates that I am supporting are likely to win in the November election. They have stolen my signs... and many others... in desperate fear that the candidates that they support will fail.

On a recent FaceBook post, I have seen this statement: "Why do people feel the need to broadcast to everyone that drives by who they are voting for?? All that sign does is make you a target, keep your votes to yourselves." So this person is warning me NOT to publicly display my support for candidates that I prefer. A very strange thing about this warning is that, around Hiram village, I still see an abundance of Trump-Vance and Nathan Wadsworth signs. Can this person explain to me why I should not express my support for Harris-Walz and Sekera, while it is OK for others to express support for Trump, Vance and Wadsworth. Apparently, the Facebook author believes that THEY should be making decisions for me, and that I should not express my own opinions.

Another statement says that they are stealing signs "because the other side is doing that." I cannot assure that anyone on "either side" has never stolen a sign. All that I can say for certain is that ALL of my signs have been stolen, and most of the signs around Hiram Village for Trump-Vance and Nathan Wadsworth are still up. I see those signs every day. I will always defend the rights of supporters of Trump-Vance and Wadsworth to display their signs, and I strongly condemn anyone who steals the signs of ANY candidates.

I strongly support the campaigns of Kamala Harris, Tim Walz, Nickie Sekera, and Jared Golden. I urge others to vote for them to support free speech, to support human rights for all men, women and children irregardless of race, color or ethnic origins, and to support all the other rights and freedoms guaranteed to us by the U.S. Constitution and all of its amendments.

When it was time to retire, he moved to New England to be closer to his kids, settling in Maine.







Town of Standish REFERENDUM VOTE

Election Day: Tuesday, November 5, 2024

Question 1. Shall the Town approve the charter amendments summarized below?

Summary of Amendments: The proposed charter amendments will add language to two existing sections of the Town Charter to allow an individual who resides on a parcel of land that is located in more than one of the four areas of Standish listed in Section 201 of the Town Charter to be considered a resident of each area and to seek election to the Town Council or Planning Board as a representative to any of the areas in which the individual resides, but once that selection is made, the individual is committed to that area for as long as he/she resides at that property. The purpose of the proposed amendments is to address an ambiguity that exists under the current language, which does not address this situation. The complete text of the proposed amendments is on file at the office of the Town Clerk.

The Standish Town Charter was adopted by the voters of Standish on November 4, 1986. At that time, some of the Town Council area boundary lines were laid on tracts of undeveloped land. It has been identified that development has occurred in some of these boundary areas where parcels have been created that are located in one or more of the Town Council representation areas. The purpose of this amendment is to address an ambiguity that exists under the current language, which does not address this situation.

Question 2. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Council to apply, on behalf of the Town, for federal financing assistance under the provisions of the Land and Water Conservation Fund Act ("LWCFA"), Public Law 88-578, for the construction of pickleball courts, a basketball court, accessible walking paths, and other park enhancements at Johnson field (the "Project"); to further authorize the Council to enter into the Land and Water Conservation Fund Project Agreement with the State of Maine subsequent to federal approval of the Project; to see if the Town will vote to authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds and/or bond anticipation notes to include the principal amount of up to \$300,000 to finance the Project, as set forth in the Council's proposed capital projects budget for the 2025-2026 Fiscal Year, with the dates, maturities, denominations, interest rate(s) and other details of such borrowing to be determined by the Council; and to see if the Town will vote to appropriate the proceeds of said bonds or bond anticipation notes for the foregoing projects, plus an amount necessary to refund the interest payments on any bond anticipation notes issued for said purpose and any costs of issuance of the bonds and/or bond anticipation notes.

(Fiscal Note: The Town expects to borrow up to \$300,000 but has applied for a grant in the amount of \$150,000 under the LWCFA which, if awarded, will be used to refund that portion of the costs of the Project when received. The borrowing is expected to consist of \$150,000 principal amount of short-term debt to be repaid with the grant proceeds and \$150,000 principal amount of long-term debt to be paid through other Town revenue. The total estimated debt service for the \$150,000 long-term borrowing is \$179,301.01, of which principal is \$150,000 and estimated interest at an average rate of 3.73% over 10 years is \$29,301.01.)

The proposed expenditure being requested by the Parks & Recreation Department will serve as matching funds required for a federal grant application to add 2 additional designated pickleball courts, standard basketball court, and ADA walking paths from the parking lot into the park. The scope of work for this project includes construction of a 60x60 asphalt pad with 4' fence for designated pickleball courts with installation of all nets, posts, and court lines. A new basketball court surface, 2 new hoops and painted lines. Lastly, the creation of the ADA paths that will help individuals move throughout the park. All the above-mentioned additions would enhance Johnson Field Park while also making the park accessible to everyone wishing to utilize it. The total estimated cost is estimated to be \$300,000.

Question 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the issuance of general obligation bonds and/or bond anticipation notes to include the principal amount of up to \$1,000,000 for the purpose of financing the construction of repairs and improvements to the culvert that crosses Strout Brook at Middle Road and the surrounding roadway, with the dates, maturities, denominations, interest rate(s) and other details of such borrowing to be determined by the Town Council, and to see if the Town will vote to appropriate the proceeds of said bonds or bond anticipation notes for the foregoing project, plus an amount necessary to refund the interest payments on any bond anticipation notes issued for said purpose, and any costs of issuance of the bonds and/or bond anticipation notes.

(Fiscal Note: This capital expenditure will be financed from a portion of the proceeds of general obligation bonds to be issued in a total principal amount of up to \$1,000,000. Total estimated debt service is \$1,210,527.42, of which principal is \$1,000,000 and estimated interest at an average rate of 3.6%, over 10 years is \$210,527.42).

In June of 2024, the Strout Brook Culvert failed where it crosses the Middle Road. A sink hole formed in the center of Middle Road creating a substantial traffic hazard. A temporary road repair was done to make the road passable. Upon further inspection of the sink hole, it was determined that it was caused by a failing culvert and roadway material washing down stream. The inspection determined the culvert had no bottom and structural strength was weakened. Approximately 40 houses are after the culvert on Middle Road and have very limited access if the culvert completely fails.

Lies; Damn Lies; and Statistics, Part II

The Shopping Guide for October 23, 2024, contains a full-page response to our earlier published Part I.

Lies, Damn Lies, and Statistics appreciate that the authors of the response are engaging in peaceful and civil discourse worthy of our respect. I do not know the individual signers of the response nor have we ever met them to the best of my knowledge. Crime Rates are Falling?

Not contained in the release but by a search of the before and after data, we now know that violent crime actually increased 4.5% in 2022. That includes 1,699 murders, 7,780 rapes, over 33,000 robberies, and 37,000 more aggravated assaults that were not in the initial data. (We had warned about spurious data in our Part I lead-in.)

Our FBI didn't own up to the real numbers in the press release, instead only those who dug into the data base discovered it. Worse still, Media Miss reports that 0% of left leaning media (most of US media) has reported this. I believe there is a concerted effort on the part of the Biden/Harris administration to hide the numbers when they don't like them.

Drug Overdose Deaths.

We pointed out in Part I that drug overdose rates in the US have increased by a massive 36% in the first three years of the Biden/Harris Administration from the rate during the four years of President Trump.
